The burnt out trailer at 124 So Wesley has been demolished. 202 So Livingston cleaned up, zoning working on the house. Linden Ave. property in process of being sold and buyer is to clean up. No word back on cleanup of 142 So. Wesley.

NEW BUSINESS: Supervisor Gary Budd reported the solar farm off of Shaler Rd. is to go before Zoning in March and before the County Board in April.

The Town & Road District Budgets were submitted to the Board for review. Board will vote on the budgets at the April regular board meeting.
