Proceedings of Town Trustees Meeting held in the Town of Springfield

The Board of Trustees of Springfield Township met May 11, 2022 at the Township Administration Building at 3298 Terminal Ave, Springfield, IL.

Present: Supervisor Gary Budd, Trustees Shannon Lynch, Mike Morris, Arthur Watts, Shelly Turnbull, Clerk Robert Remack, Road District Commissioner Ron Smith, Assessor Cinda Sausaman.

Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Supervisor Gary Budd.

The Treasurer's report and minutes of the Board Meeting of April 12, 2022 were reviewed. A motion was made by Arthur Watts and seconded by Shannon Lynch to accept the treasurer's report and approve the minutes. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Bills were submitted to the Town Board for authorization to pay. A motion was made by Mike Morris and seconded by Shelly Turnbull that said bills be authorized for payment. All voted aye. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Unsure of amount collected from the dumpster program held the first Saturday of the month.

Supervisor Gary Budd reported on the 32nd St./ Ridgewood Ave. Water Project. Mike Johnson at CWLP submitted updated bid of \$151,000.00 for Ridgewood Ave. only, which is a 25% increase over last year's bid. A grant has been filed in the amount of \$300,000.00 for both streets. The Township will know more around end of May or June and if everything goes alright, project could start by Labor Day.

Paving and striping of the administration building parking lot was discussed by the Board. The required postings for bids were followed. Only one bid was submitted. Ron Furman submitted the bid in amount of \$43,585.00. The bid must be accepted within 20 days and payment is due upon completion of work. The project is to be funded by carry-over money from last year. A motion was made by Mike Morris and seconded by Shannon Lynch to accept the bid of \$43,585.00 submitted by Ron Furman. An individual voice vote was taken. All voted aye. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS: Supervisor Gary Budd directed Attorney John Kerley to contact Sangamon County Dept. of Public Health and request the clean-up of the burned out mobile home at 151 S. Wesley St. He also directed the Attorney to contact the County regarding complaints about cars being stored, moved around and possibly sold at 120 and 128 So. Wesley.

Motion to adjourn was made by Mike Morris and seconded by Shelly Turnbull. All voted aye. Motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 6:58 p.m.
