The Treasurer's report and minutes of the Board Meeting June 14, 2017 were reviewed. A motion was made by Arthur Watts and seconded by Shannon Lynch to accept the treasurer's report and approve the minutes. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Bills were submitted to the Town Board for authorization to pay. Included were \$17.90 to Carter Bros Lumber and \$844.00 to Lindsay Electric for lighting on the new sign and to repair lighting around the building. A motion was made by Shannon Lynch and seconded by Arthur Watts that said bills be authorized for payment. All voted aye. Motion carried.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** \$255.00 was collected from Dumpster Program Operations this month.

Becky Nevill, Consultant with Ambit Energy spoke again about purchasing energy from Ambit. Supervisor Gary Budd wants to discuss this with Clear Lake Township who does business with them before proceeding. He invited her back next month.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Supervisor Gary Budd said a bank loan for \$50,000.00 has been approved for the installation of water to the township building. Attorney Don LoBue is in the process of working to get an intergovernmental agreement with the City by next month in order to proceed.
